TEACHING KIDS TO BE SAFE FOR MORE THAN 35 YEARS

Every summer in Santa Barbara, over five hundred kindergarten and first grade children prepare for the school year by participating in a Safety Town program sponsored by Soroptimist International of Santa Barbara (SISB). During the five-day program, they learn the essential skills they will need in their daily activities at school and at home.



Each Safety Town session starts on a Monday when parents and children arrive at the school site where they find a carefully laid out city built to the scale of a small child. Miniature buildings line a grid of streets complete with traffic signs and signals. Each child receives a bright yellow tee shirt to wear during program sessions. After a brief orientation meeting, the children say goodbye to

their parents and break into small groups led by volunteer teen counselors and supervised by staff.

In these groups, the children learn and practice safety skills. They learn how to safely cross the street and how to obey traffic signals. They practice these skills while walking and while driving miniature cars, complete with safety belts. They are taught safety at railroad crossings, safe bicycle interaction, personal and stranger safety, and how to handle potentially unsafe situations when at play or in the home. Videos, craft projects, songs, and games reinforce the safe conduct rules the children have learned.



Visits from community agency representatives, including police, firefighters, forest rangers and bus drivers, augment the program.



Safety Town is staffed by paid credentialed teachers and assistants. Volunteers from the National Charity League and teen volunteers (Counselors in Training) work with the children under staff supervision. Members of SISB volunteer their time to organize and publicize the program.

Safety Town has been in operation in Santa Barbara for over 35 years as a fee-for-service summer camp. In recent years, SISB has offered scholarships to economically disadvantaged children. With the help of several generous community organizations and foundations, program enrollment has more than doubled.
