IMPACT REPORT 2022—2023





The aim of Safety Town is to foster safety awareness and introduce important safety skills to pre- and post-kindergarten children. This objective is achieved through a comprehensive 17.5-hour course, with daily sessions lasting 3.5 hours per day for one week. Throughout this program, children engage in interactive activities to learn essential safety procedures.



Guided by trained professionals, the children participate in real-life scenarios and gain hands-on experience. The instructional methods employed include presentations by community safety professionals, puppet shows, art projects, songs, and practical demonstrations on the playground and within Safety Town, which is designed to replicate a child's scale and surroundings.

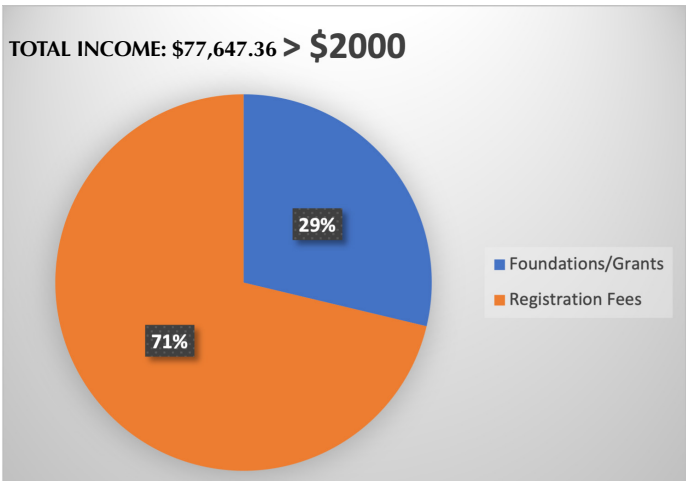
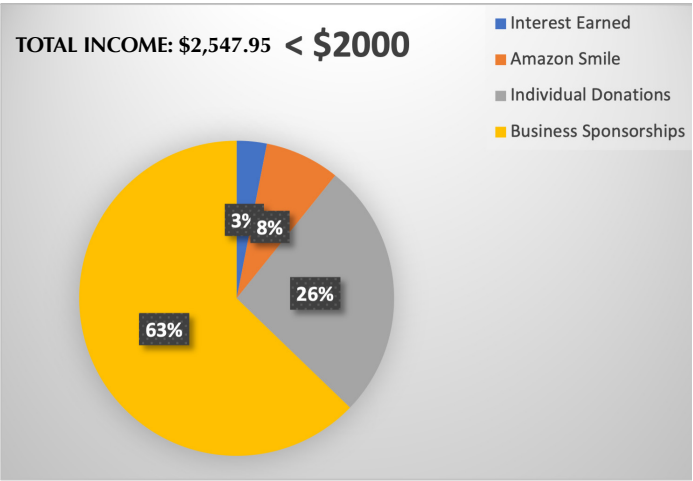
The generous ratio of one counselor-in-training (CIT) to two young campers was a key factor contributing to the success of Safety Town’s summer sessions. CITs engaged individually with each child, providing reinforcement, guidance, support, modeling and a constant presence throughout a variety of learning activities. For the young children, having a dedicated buddy in their CIT made them feel supported every day of the program.

Each CIT earned an average of 25-40 community service hours. They served as positive role models and also gained valuable leadership and teaching experience. The pairing of these two age groups—connecting young children with high school volunteers—proved to be highly effective and rewarding for everyone involved.

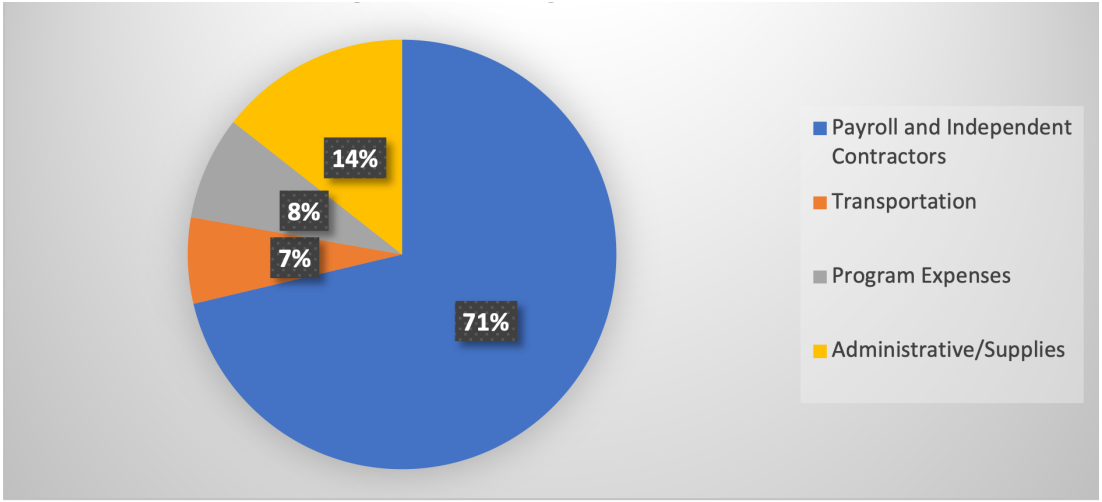

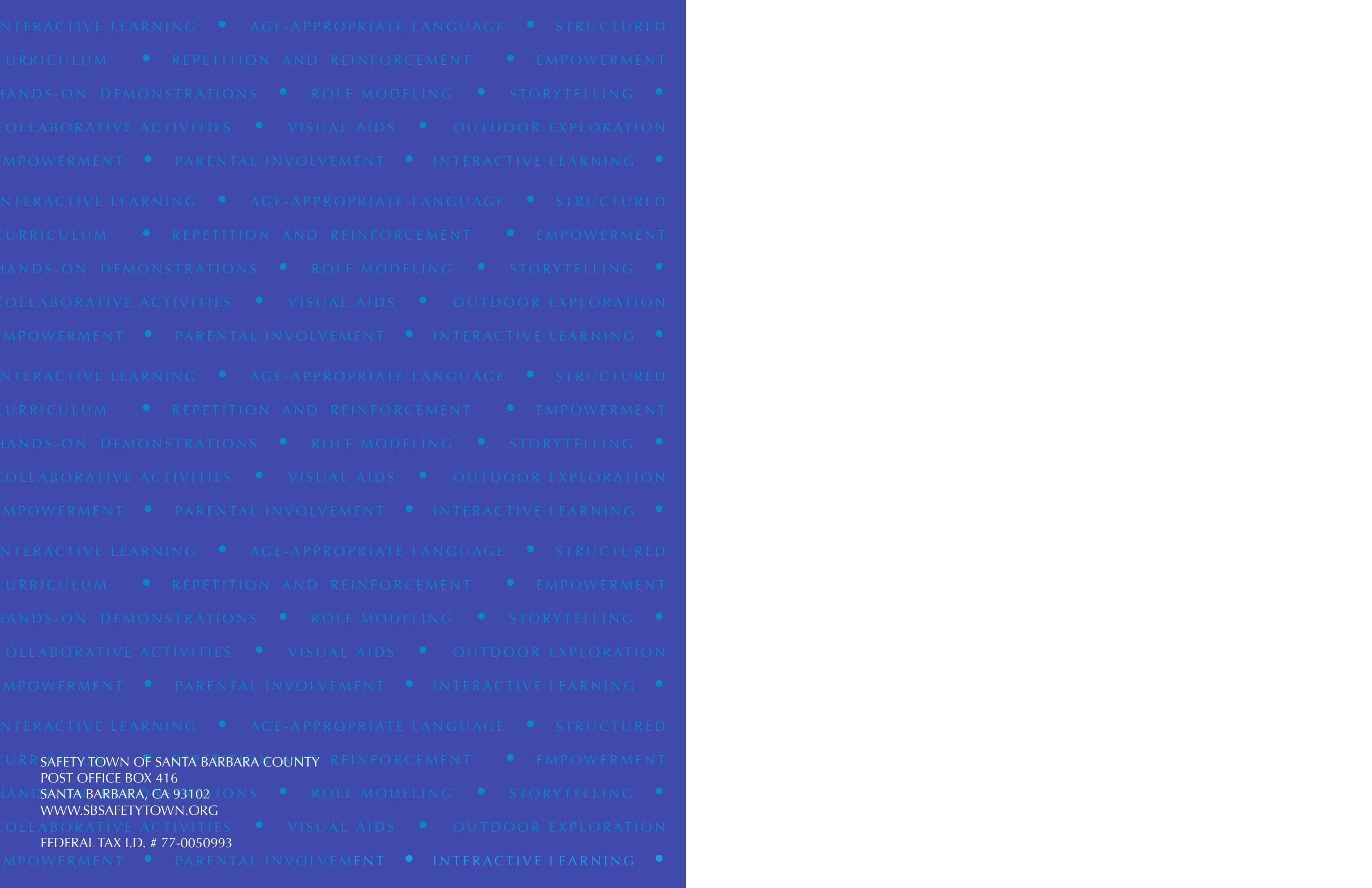
